In the environment of possibilities, Keshav Srushti stepped in to make a difference by involving children and parents in one of the unique events of our times. Last year, on 4th, January 2014, it organized an event with participation of 3639 students and achieved an unique distinction for holding the largest solar cooking festival in the world and, incidentally made an entry in Guinness, Asia, India & Limca books of world records. The organization continued with its mission to propagate importance of the 'Akshay Oorja' for overall betterment of our society by inspiring people to adopt sustainable energy practices.

Inspired by the grand success of Suryakumbha 2014, and positive effects it created on the minds of children and youth, this year Keshav Srushti decided to organize an awareness drive on bigger scale by holding similar events concurrently at multiple locations with participation of many school. Mahasuryakumbha - 2015, is an outcome of this initiative on a much larger scale with participation of over 15,000 students across various schools in Mumbai, Navi Mumbai and rural areas of Thane District from 15th January till 31st January 2015. To make it more inclusive, Keshav Srushti took special efforts to reach out to tribal students from Javhar, Mokhada, Vikramgad and Shahapur. All these children were sponsored by some donors. Whereas, this will send a strong message to the countrymen about Clean India Campaign as it will help cut down pollution and also will save the overused energy sources like gas, coal and wood.


Never before had so many people experienced the simplicity of harnessing solar energy, using ordinary materials and creating a festival out of it.

GOAN-BORN JOSEPH VAZ GRANTED SAINTHOOD BY POPE FRANCIS IN SRI LANKA



Thousands of Indians travelled to Colombo to witness to canonization.

The pope told to the crowd that Vaz was an example of religious tolerance relevant to Sri Lanka.

"Saint Joseph shows us the importance of transcending religious divisions in the service of peace," he said, delivering a message resonant for the nation recovering from a long war between mainly Buddhist Sinhalese and Hindu Tamils.

Vaz, who was captured as a suspected spy after he crept into the tropical island in disguise was born in 1651 in India's Goa, then a Portuguese colony.

Francis, speaking slowly in English, said Christians should follow the example of Vaz to build peace, justice and reconciliation in Sri Lanka. Catholics make up about 7 percent of Sri Lanka's population, while 10 times as many people follow Buddhism.

ope Francis gave Sri Lanka its first saint on He bent Church rules and dispensed with a regulation that normally requires a second miracle to be attributed to a candidate for sainthood. Vaz was beatified by Pope John Paul during a visit to Sri Lanka 20 years ago.

> Vaz remained in Kandy until his death in 1711, by which time the Church says he had converted 30,000 people and created a network of priests, almost single handedly re-establishing Catholicism in Ceylon.

He completed his secondary education in Marathi and went on to graduate in metallurgical engineering from IIT Bombay in 1978. He is the first IIT graduate to become the Chief Minister of any Indian state. He was awarded by IIT Bombay with the Distinguished Alumnus Award in 2001. During his tenure as Chief Minister, the State of Goa witnessed significant involvement of youngsters in politics. He was reluctant to leave Goa and move to Delhi, and had to take a tough decision to accept persuasive request of our Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who has highest regards for Parrikar's abilities and to manage crucial portfolio of Defense. We all feel safe with Bhai, as our nation's security is in competent hands.

We congratulate **CA SURESH PRABHU** son-in-law of Goa, for his induction into the Council of Ministers on November 9, 2014 and for being appointed as Railway Minister of India. Suresh Prabhu completed his high school from Sharadashram Vidya Mandir, Dadar, Mumbai, followed by a Bachelor in Commerce with Honours from M.L. Dahanukar College, Vile Parle, Mumbai. He received a Bachelor in Law degree from the New Law College, Mumbai. Suresh Prabhu is a Chartered Accountant with a rank in CA exam. He is concurrently working on two Ph.D. programs in Climate Change from Frei University Berlin and Public Finance from Mumbai University.

Suresh Prabhu has held several government and semi government positions, which in cludes chairmanship of Maharashtra State Finance Commission,



Saraswat Co-operative Bank, Member of the Maharashtra Tourism Development Board, among others. Suresh Prabhu has travelled to more than 100 countries. He is working with 16 global organizations and on 9 strategic dialogues. He was Cabinet Minister in Atal Bihari Vajpaee's Government at various times during 1998 to 2004 as Industry Minister, Minister of Environment and Forests, Minister of Fertilizers & Chemicals, Power, Heavy Industry and Public Enterprises. As the Union Minister for Power he won praise for his performance. As Minister of Power, Suresh Prabhu introduced major reforms in India's power sector. He is credited with championing and enacting the Electricity Act of 2003 and

the reforms that created securitization of dues from the states. He was also Chairman of Task Force for Interlinking of Rivers with a status and rank of Union Cabinet Minister. He was elected a member of the World Bank parliamentary network and chaired the South Asia Water regional group of the World Bank. Asiaweek rated him as one of

Manohar Parrikar, Rajendra Arlekar, now Goa Assembly Speaker, and Shripad Naik, Union Minister for Tourism.




TREASURE TROVE OF CHILDREN'S KONKANI LITERARY ITEMS RELEASED

MADHAVI SARDESAI passed away on 22nd December 2014, just 3 days after she was declared as chosen for the prestigious Sahitya Akademi award for her book of essays 'Manthan'.

She was the editor of the Konkani literary journal 'Jaag' & also a scholar, publisher & writer who worked mainly in the Konkani language in Goa.

She headed the Goa university's Konkani department.

She had earlier bagged the Sahitya Akademi award for the translation of her book Eka Vicharachi Jivit Katha on the life of Mahatma Gandhi. Her work includes Bhasabhas a book on linguistic, Mankullo Raj Kunvor, a translation of children's novelette 'The little prince' from French to Konkani & several poems, essays, short stories & research papers on Konkani language.

RAGHUVIR NEVREKAR Senior Marathi and Kokani actor, director passed away on 23rd November 2014, at the age of 85 after a brief illness.

His character Falgunrao, in Marathi musical play Saunshay kallol was well known. He even starred in first Marathi T.V. serial Shwetambara in the 1980s. He was also one of the earliest playwrights for konkani radio plays. His konkani play Poppe Babali Mumbay was popular for its humorous characterization of the 'poppe bab's' visit to Mumbai.

Nevrekar was active member of the Goa Hindu Association. He was also the uncle of well known actor Ashok Saraf.

PADMABHUSHAN DR. JOSE PEREIRA,

USA, eminent Sanskrit scholar, historian, musicologist, writer, linguist and artist,

passed away in USA after prolonged illness. He was 84.

Dr. Pereira was hailed from Curtorim in Salcete taluka of Goa.

He graduated

with Honours in Sanskrit in 1951 from Siddharth College and obtained PhD in Ancient History and Culture from St Xavier's College in 1949.

Dr. Jose Pereira has to his credit 145 research articles and papers on several issues and 24 books on diverse subjects in literature, architecture, theology, music etc, like 'Hindu Theology', 'Monolithic Jinas', 'Konkani Mandakini', 'Songs of Goa (Mando)' and 'Golden Goa's Art'.

Dr. Juse Pereira was a strong proponent of Konkani as a language. Government of India had conferred on him the Padma Bhushan in 2012, recognizing his contribution to Indian history and literature.



- A housing society does not have to pay capital gains tax when it sells additional FSI to a builder, says a recent Bombay high court order. Development Control regulation, 1991, provide for grant of additional FSI if an existing building is redeveloped. The society can utilize it either for extension of the existing
- building, construction of a new building or even sell it to a builder.
- The favourable order will bring cheer to many old housing societies that have entered into redevelopment agreements or plan to do so.
- Above HC tax order on FSI sale is set to boost redevelopment.


